Volunteer Interview

We chat with Gillian Douglas, a volunteer on our executive committee.

Describe your NESYFC role... I 'line manage' Steven, our Outreach Worker. I try to encourage him, pray for his work and make sure he's not doing too much.

How did you become a Christian? I grew up in the Church of Scotland and it was a kind

of gradual thing. I didn't have a particular moment when I thought, 'Hey, I believel'. I have just always known that God was there for me and I try to live my life in a caring way, reflecting what I believe and the love of Jesus.

What do you do in your day job? I have two jobs. I work 20 hours a week for Chest Heart & Stroke Scotland, managing their Volunteer Stroke Service in Aberdeen which provides opportunities for stroke victims who have communication difficulties. My other job is leading a new Befriending Service at Newhills Church.

What's good about working with young people? Seeing them grow in their faith and being challenged about what I believe and what my faith means to me.



What's our outreach worker been up to?

Regular Work

My usual week-by-week work during term time is mainly split into two areas around Aberdeen: Oldmachar and Oldmeldrum.

In **Oldmachar** we run a Rock Solid club on Tuesday nights, with 20-25 kids and new faces every week. On Friday nights (with another chap) we do a Compass Course (basic knowledge of Christian faith for new Christians), mainly to equip some of the older teenagers and see their faith strengthened. The idea is empowering them to help lead youth-zone, an outreach event that has proven to be very popular in the past. There is also a monthly Sunday youth service; the last one was on 17th April and very encouraging. A great outreach opportunity and encouragement for the other members of the community.

Wednesday lunch times. I join a couple of the local ministers engaging with the kids by meeting them, chatting to them, playing football and occasionally going through Bible stories. It is very early stage still and I am focusing on getting to know the kids, allowing them to ask questions about Christian faith. We are thankful that the school is so open, and are also praying for the possibility of starting a youth event for kids in the Meldrum area.


Prayer Points

Occasional Work

I've been trying to offer NESYFC's resources to more churches and school works as needed. One good way to focus effort is linking with our monthly Breathe event. The Tuesday prior to March's event I went to Inverbervie with a few of our volunteers and met with the local youth worker, Gill. In the primary school we gave P6 & P7 five-minute slots of fun, a wee taster of the Breathe event with an invitation to the kids to come. It was received very well and a couple then came to the event.

Another opportunity came by the grace of God with my local academy (Cults). Some of the young Christians in the school have been boldly running Youth Alpha on Wednesday lunch times, with up to 30 young people at times. I was invited to join their day away on the 26th of March and gave a wee talk on the Holy Spirit. 12 kids were there and the prayer is that they may know his powerful work in their lives!

In Oldmeldrum, the work is mainly in the local Academy on On the 28-29th of March I helped with a great outreach program "Bible Travellers", run by St. Columba's Church in Bridge of Don, for local primary schools. We had a great couple of days. On 15th April we ran a "soccer day" in Cults for kids of the local primary and secondary schools. Very exciting: 7 of the 10 young people who came responded positively to the Gospel message and "prayed the prayer"! The day was organised by St. Devenick's Episcopal Church in Bieldside and

hosted by International Baptist Church in Cults with the help of Deeside Christian Fellowship Church. What a privilege for NESYFC to be involved in churches working together!

We are also slightly involved with Ellon Academy who had special Easter Assemblies on the 1st of April. There will be guite a few Easter special messages in these few weeks (also at the clubs) so please pray for kids to be saved!
