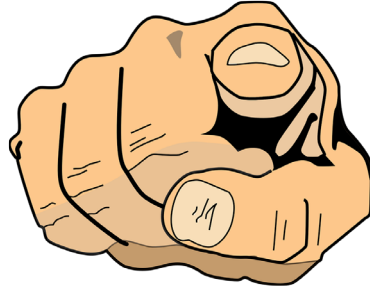


We Need You!

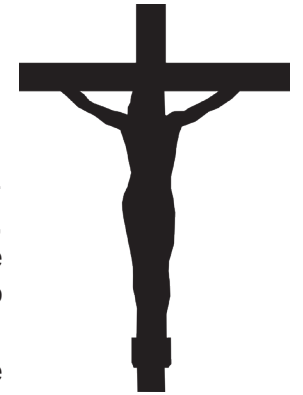

Hank's Panel

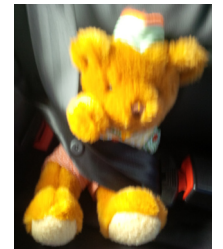

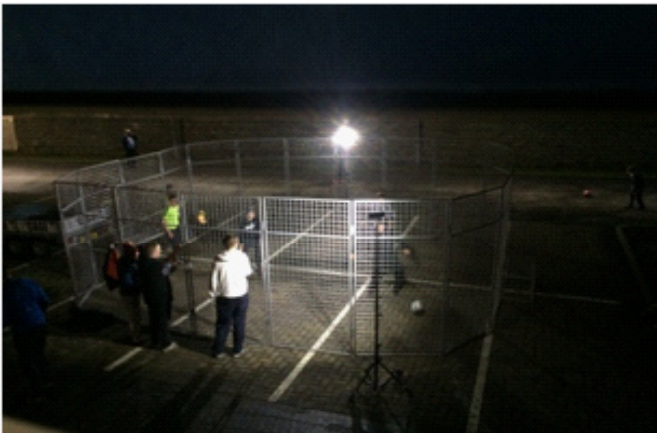
Outreach update

News from youth worker Curtis Sangbarani on what's been happening over the winter period.

Cage football on Monday nights has started great with the partnership between Seaton and Dyce churches. This happens in Seaton Primary School car park Monday evenings every fortnight and attracts over 20 kids from the surrounding areas.

Alongside the Cage is the Dyce double decker bus which has been converted into a relaxed and safe place for the kids to hang out. It has video games, tuck shop, and hang out spots for them to use.

We have made use of the Lord Provost Charitable funding to purchase flood lights for the cage football and it has been very beneficial especially during these cold and dark nights!



Each Tuesday is school pastoring, which is spent half the time within the school and the other half within the school lunch club which has exploded in numbers in the past weeks! The lunch club is now so full we have to cap numbers, it is such a positive

development! The lunch club is a chilled spot for the kids to come, in this space they can find friendships, feel secure and get away from the hustle and bustle of school life!



TLG (Transforming Lives for Good Education Charity) is going well. The pupil I have been befriending I have seen a vast improvement with his personal struggles and also encouraging to hear from teachers and head teacher that his behaviour has dramatically improved within the classroom. Befriending outside the school, we meet every fortnight to do fun activities such as bowling and golf. It's an opportunity to be a mentor and build relationship.

SAMS Seaton is still getting a great turnout for the after school club, we have many more volunteers and it is an enthusiastic time with the kids to learn about God. We really feel we have seen a lot of progression over the year with the kids, in terms of the interest and knowledge of His Word. Riverbank football happens every Wednesday - it has been going fantastically! The consistency of the team turnout has been so inspiring for the coaches, having 15 plus kids every week for training. A year ago we would struggle to get 4-5 on a regular basis throughout the week. Also for the games for Saturdays, it is very exciting for us as coaches as well as the parents to be able to watch their kids

develop on and off the field. Also it is a joy to watch the team win most weeks!

On Thursdays I help out both the SU groups at Riverbank and the Lighthouse lunch club. The lunch club has a consistent turnout from St Machar academy pupils. Since the SU group has started it has been a huge success. The kids look forward to this time every week.

NESYFC are always looking for ways to progress and reach volunteers, churches and let them know about the working that is happening. At the moment there is a video in progress being made, to tell people what we do on a day to day basis and the cage football. The video will be a tool to reach churches and gain support in all ways.
