Welcome

Hi, and welcome to our latest newsletter.

Another year has just passed us by and we sit, as it were, looking out over this new year. We can but wonder what it holds for us, what route our life journey will take, what storms and challenges will arise.

As individuals, and as a ministry, as we face our storms and challenges, we need to remember who has called us to the journey we take. Mark 4: 35-41 and the question asked in v41 come to mind: "Who is this? Even the wind and the waves obey him!"

When we consider that question, we find that the answer was and is, Jesus was Man – and Jesus was and is God. At the height of the storm, when the boat was about to be swamped, where was Jesus? He was "in the stern of the boat, asleep on a pillow."

Jesus Christ the man was indeed sound asleep, exhausted and in need of rest for his body and mind. Jesus Christ – God – certainly was not. He was not oblivious to the situation developing around him. He knew about the storm and He knew about the fear of the disciples. Jesus Christ was not about to let His disciples die as a result of this storm. He knew that their time had not yet come.

CHRISTMAS EVENTS

We were involved in various Christmas celebration events, all of which thankfully went ahead despite the heavy snow around the end of the school term.

Radiate kids had a typical Christmas party which went amazingly well with a sky high level of excitement among them leading up to and during the party. They all totally enjoyed the fun, food and games.

Illuminate teens had a food night and were given options as to what type of food they wanted - Pizza was the winner. They were really well behaved and had a really special night together and enjoyed the food, games and a short Christmas talk.

The Youth Drop-in continues to run twice a month on a Friday night and remains very popular with the young people who attend. Drop-in is a very relational group where we focus on getting alongside and building relationships with the young people who come along, and at the same time providing a safe space where they can hang out and relax with their friends.

A typical Drop-in would have table tennis, table football, air hockey, tuck shop, play station and a short testimony slot (which the young people continue to be very interested in). IN SCHOOLS WORK

Weekly Five-a-side football continues to be very popular with the kids. It's great to spend time outside, have fun together and build relationships with them.

Thursday's Riverbank SU continues going well and has seen encouraging growth in interest in the Bible lessons and numbers attending. We are very thankful that an additional volunteer has come on board to help in running this group.

A huge encouragement has been the re-start of Bible Alive, which slots in well with the school Curriculum requirements, and takes P6 children through the Bible in 7 weeks by acting, kid's involvement, teaching sign language. The first few sessions have gone very well, with strong engagement from both the children and teachers.

Another huge encouragement is that Matthew has been asked by SU to help out with an SU group in Northfield Academy (weekly half hour slot) with 5 - 6 teenagers.

Radiate (P4 - P7 weekly kids club) has largely gone well, although we have been challenged by a drop in numbers attending regularly and some of the older children acting in a way which has put some of space for young people the younger children off attending. The behaviour issue has been dealt with and numbers attending are recovering.
