We catch up with director Steven and what he's been worked with Gionathan (remember doing in the past few months. 

The kids seemed to have a good time and participated well in the games and talk.

It was really good to be in Oldmachar (May 19) where we've been working for a while now. Honestly speaking it was a bit discouraging that not many of our "Rock Solid" group there attended, but it was encouraging to see quite a few others from Oldmachar and other youth groups despite the clash with the Champions' League final and the "Bridge of Don's Got Talent" final! We spoke about superheroes (seeing the Avengers new film...) and about the amazing truth of a Lamb who was slain being the real superhero that ultimately defeats evil and injustice to bring in a new world! The kids again responded well and participated in the talk. One of our volunteers - Nehe - also brought a wee band together of young people from different churches that had never played together, and they did a great job!
